Builder's Corner By Dick Robb



The pictures that accompany this months column are primarily of the tools I have talked about when I started building the Shearwater seaplane.

Item A are the dihedral angle templates. The longer one is used to cut the root end of the spars before installation. The smaller templates have bottom tabs glued on and they are pinned down at the root rib. The rib is tilted and pinned to the top of the templates and when the rib is glued the cutout on the base tab allows the rib to be glued without harming the template.

Item B are the capture blocks used to hold the bottom spars in place prior to gluing.

Item C is the template with the cup hooks attachments used to cut the wing ribs.

Item D is nothing more than a large tuna fish can. I use these cans and also the smaller ones to hold parts or templates as needed when building or repairing my models. You need several of these in your shop.

Item E is a customized Robart foam cradle. The base is original but the supports are made from hardware foam with tapered slits in them. These are primarily used to support the wing in a vertical position during construction. This is one of the most used tools in my shop.

Items F are wing rib alignment and holding tools for installing ribs. In the plywood one the slot (in this case 1/8") is a snug fit to the balsa and 90 degrees to the bottom. In use the template is rocked forward forcing the rib down against the bottom sheeting. The glue can then be applied with the other hand while the rib stays aligned. The orange unit is a commercial unit from House of Balsa but I do not believe it works as well.

The second picture shows the airframe as it is currently. The paper Christmas wrap tube will allow the aileron servo lead to be installed after the panel is finished. What is not shown is a sleeve made of bubble wrap that will cover the left wing panel and protect it from hanger rash while finishing the right panel. The model at this time is about 60 percent done and about 18 hours have been spent getting to this point.

If you have decided to build a single channel airplane from the 60's or 70's some changes may have to be made. I have built ailerons into the wing, reduced the dihedral in the wing, and enlarged the rudder and elevator. These changes will allow the model to fly a little more lively but it should still be docile. When this model and others like it were designed the radio system was very rudimentary. A spring loaded switch was held and the control (say right rudder) went hard over and stayed there as long as the switch was held. If you wanted additional right rudder the switch had to be pulsed through left rudder before right rudder was again available. Because of this slow control response most single channel models were in fact free flight aircraft interrupted by radio. However, if you would like a docile aircraft build the model you have selected just as it was designed. You will have a great trainer. Next time we will use unconventional materials in our models.

New Event Announcement

ROGUE EAGLES WINTER BUILD CHALLENGE

The main goal of the Winter Build Challenge is to stimulate and encourage traditional model building within the club. It will also be a good platform for sharing modeling techniques and will hopefully provide some good content for our newsletter and facebook page.

The WBC is for experienced builders and beginners alike. It's important to know you will NOT be judged at any time on your building skills. The end game for this event will be a maiden flight party, some time in the Spring of 2018 (probably April). All entries will be expected to make their maiden flight, one-at-a-time, on that day. If you are not comfortable flying your plane, you can have somebody else do the test flight. After all of the maiden flights are done, successful builders become eligible to win prizes or cool stuff yet to be determined, and the field will be opened for normal flying activities.

Here's the Challenge:

- Must be a NEW build from a balsa kit or plans. No repair jobs of previously flown aircraft. No ARFs. No foamies.
- Previously started kits are okay, but they should have no covering and the framework must be less than 50% completed.
- Models must be radio-controlled, of any size or complexity, and powered with glow, gas, or electric.
- To enter, you must post at least one current photo showing the starting point of your project on our facebook page or in this newsletter.
 Remember, this is a social event - no secret projects allowed.
- To finish the challenge, your plane must be flown at the maiden flight party.
 The plane must take off, make at least one lap, and land.
- The Challenge is open to any AMA member.

For now, let's consider these guidelines to be semi-fluid.

There may be good reasons to make some tweaks down the line. It's not like this is a competition. The idea is to challenge yourself, learn a thing or two, and have fun.

If you are a relative newcomer to building, take some time to research your kit options and talk with a few experienced club members for ideas and advice. If you are an established builder, grab a kit out of your stash and start gluing!

- Here are the build challenge rules! Remember to post your picture on our Facebook page.
 - 1. Must be a new build from a balsa kit. No repairs jobs of previously flown aircraft.
- 2. New builds can be scratch built or assembled from a kit--(no arfs). Entries can be built from balsa, foam, or other materials. No ARF's or Foamies.
- 3. Previously started kits ok, but must be less than 50% completed/not covered when picture is posted.
- 4. Can be any size or type of kit (lock/tab, die cut, scratch built)
- 5. Can be glow, gas or electric
- 6. Open to any AMA club member
- 7. Must be completed prior to AND flown at maiden party
- 8. All progress photos will be shared with the

American Cancer Society Relay For Life events bring communities to-




