A letter from the President

Economic Awareness

At the last membership meeting of SFRCF It was suggested by former club President Jody Diaz that, the current President write a letter to be included in the upcoming club news letter. The subject of this letter had made itself apparent earlier in this same meeting as the group present discussed the upcoming pylon races scheduled for August 30th and 31st.

What we discovered was that a number of the members who usually work these events in a variety of capacities from timers, pylon workers, fuel supervisors and our heroes, the lunch prep crew, had other commitments with family events. This, of course, is not an issue as family should always come first. As the meeting progressed we discussed the importance of these events and how much revenue they produce to support the club's financial commitments and operational goals

Some of these goals are:

Providing a safe and appropriate areas for club activities and events To maintain active membership and recruit new members Continue community involvement (Scholarships etc) Maintain dues costs Raise revenue beyond regular membership dues to meet financial commitments



Have fun with the hobby we love and the friends we find there

Our membership profile for 2009 is:

INCOME:

43 members total, with six nonpaying; 5 children and 1 Lifetime member (WW II Veteran). This gives us 37 members for a total of \$3700.00.

EXPENSES:

The majority of our financial commitments are in the form of lease

fees:

Sanderson Field - \$3581.64/year Hunter Farms - \$800.00/year

Other costs are incurred:

Keys Locks Portable toilets Food

As you can see we pay \$4,381.64 in lease fees alone. Subtract this vears annual dues of \$3,700.00 and we have a deficit of \$681.64.

Without these scheduled events and the members who work to staff them, the club would be forced to raise the dues to survive; let alone support growth, inflation costs and prosperity.

Typically with dues increases, some members will not renew membership. Thereby the club sinks deeper into financial difficulty. The point of this "Presidential Address", if you will, is to educate the membership on this vital topic and increase awareness of the importance of these events and the much needed membership participation to support them.
