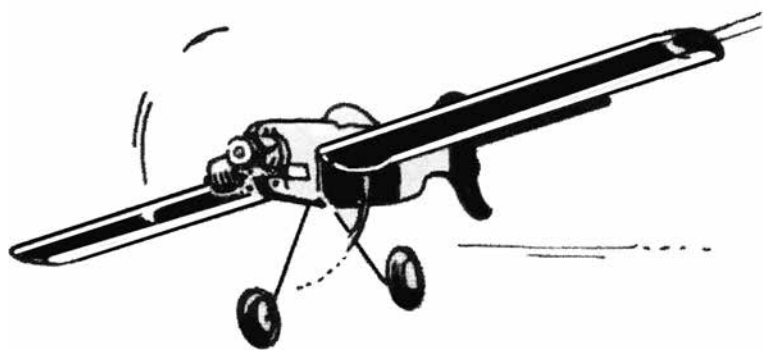
Bob Treinen has checked and cleaned the sandwich machine, it's ready to go.
