AIRPLANE REPAIR

Some of you know the trials and tribulations of this airplane, an ESM 80" P-39, from operator error to motor mount bolts falling out to major wing repair. After the last flight it seemed the motor mount bolts were loose again... but no, the firewall does not fill the fiberglass fuselage nose and apparently one of my <mishaps> damaged it slightly. The next 3 short flights weakened it more till it was enough that you could move it slightly by grabing the spinner.

So, how to go about fixing this problem. The first step was to remove everything that was in the way. Motor, gear doors, nose gear and mount and fuel lines. This made enough room to get an arm (smaller than mine! THANK YOU JACK) to get in to the firewall.

dual tube and requires an applicator and mixing tips and is very strong. Paul had the applicator and tips so Jack and I made a trip to the redneck repair shop in Olalla and ran a bead of Hysol around the firewall. We stood the plane on it's nose while the the epoxy set up and fairly quickly it was hard enough that it wouldn't run. We loaded up and came home. Thank you Paul for your time and shop.

After letting the epoxy set up for a day I reinstalled everything and noticed another problem. The hinges on the rudder seemed to be loose. After removing the pull pull cables, 2 of the 3 hinge points were completly broken so I had one hinge point and pull pull cables holding the rudder on. Yikes!

I cut the remaining hingepoint off, drilled the glued in parts out and re-epoxied new ones in.

If I didn't like P-39's so much this problem child would go the way of the dinosaurs but is does fly well even after all the repairs so I guess I'll keep trying to get used to it.

Maybe the next mishap will be the last...
